Forward

Many Bullock cousins are concerned that publishing the type personal information contained in this booklet might, in the hands of the unscrupulous, cause harm to an individual. Furthermore, information such as name, age, place of birth, parent's names, and work history, might find its way into databases that would be used for making legal sales and promotional contacts. Based on these expressed concerns, the decision was made a year ago to limit information presented on The Bullock and Rector Family Homepage on the internet to individuals born before 1900. As you read this booklet and enjoy learning about your present Bullock relatives, remember that the information contained herein is meant for use within the family only. Believe it or not, there are many list makers out there who would dearly love to have this information for their use. The booklet has been put together by and for the descendants of Herman and Drusilla Bullock only and will not be shared with libraries, genealogical societies, or historians.


Note: To meet the above concerns this privatized version contains no detailed information on living persons.

This booklet is comprised of two parts. First, in Chapters 1 through 8 presents information on all of the descendants of Herman Bullock and Drusilla Asenith Finton gathered to this date. Family group sheets, including photos if available, are shown for families of descendants down through the grandchildren of Herman and Drusilla. Information on further descendants is presented in the genealogy charts for each of the six children of Herman and Drusilla. These descendants include several great-great-grandchildren of Herman and Drusilla. Every attempt has been made to acquire information on all descendants. The second part, Chapter 9, contains information on the ancestors of Herman and Drusilla. Herman's ancestors are traced back to Richard Bullock who was born in England and arrived in Rehoboth, MA in 1643. Drusilla's Finton and Gleason ancestors are traced back several generations.

The index at the end of this booklet is an index of individuals only, not places. Names in the text portions of the booklet, such as this forward, are not included in the index. Individual's names in the family group sheets, genealogy reports and descendant's charts are indexed. However, names in the notes portion of the charts are not indexed.

About three years ago, my brothers Phil, Bob and Cal (until he died in 1998) and I started to gather together as many Bullock and Rector photos that we could lay our hands on. The family pictures were gathered from many sources, scanned (digitized), and the original sent back


to the owner. Many of these pictures have been put on the Bullock and Rector Family Home Page on the internet for our many cousins to enjoy. I now have thousands of family photos taken between the years 1860 and 2012. An example of one of these important family photos, shown to the left, is of the two oldest living descendants of Herman and Drusilla Bullock. In the summer of 1999 Herbert William "Pete" Bullock (90) and Philip Gerald Bullock (83), got together in Phil's home. They hadn't seen each other in more than 60 years.



Herman Bullock and Drusilla Asenith Finton

Herman Bullock was born in Barrington, Yates County, NY in 1848 to Calvin and Lucinda Bullock. A few years earlier Calvin and Lucinda had moved from to Barrington from Chatham, Columbia County, NY by way of Huron, Wayne County, NY. Herman married Drusilla Asenith Finton in 1871; Drusilla was born in Barrington in 1851. Herman and Drusilla had six children, all born in Crosby, Town of Barrington, Yates County, NY along the east shore of Keuka Lake. Herman was a grape grower and operated a sawmill and basket factory at his home in Crosby. Less than a mile north along the lake, one of Drusilla's brothers, George Washington Finton, also owned a vineyard and operated a grape basket factory. The photo to the right shows Drusilla and Herman at the Bullock homestead and the photo below left shows Herman, Drusilla, family and friends in front of the Bullock homestead. Both photos were taken in the late 1910's.



The following two paragraphs, from pages 455, 456, and 633 of the book "History of Yates County, NY", edited by Lewis Cass Aldrich, 1892, provide information on the Bullocks and their mill.

"The basket factories deserve more than a passing notice. The proprietor of one is Hermon Bullock, that of the other George Fenton. Ten years ago the baskets were bunched up in dozens



and sold by the dozen -- a small pony business. But the demand has grown so rapidly that the mills have been furnished with all modern machinery for manufacturing baskets, and the largest logs are sawed and sliced out and turned until ready for the baskets; and this year the output of baskets from both factories is 1,500,000, giving employment to twenty-five or thirty men and to fifty or sixty girls. The Bullock mills do the sawing and cutting


for the McMath and Morgan factories at Penn Yan. The Fenton mills furnish the Niagara Grape Company with 100,000 baskets annually. Peaches, currants, and raspberries are raised to quite an extent, and other small fruit, so that evaporators may be counted by the dozen all over the town. Among the berry growers of the town at present are Delmer Knapp and D. B. Cornell. The largest apple orchard is owned by D. B. Cornell, consisting of fifteen acres and twenty

varieties. There are six steamboat landings in Barrington: Fenton, North and South Crosby, J. Eagleston, Hawk, and S. Eagleston."

"Bullock, Herman, of Barrington, a prominent fruit grower, was born, in Yates County, N. Y., March 25, 1848, a son of Calvin and Lucinda (Simpson) Bullock. His father was one of the early settlers of the county, a farmer by occupation, and had a family of nine children, six of whom survive. He died in the county in I867, and his wife in 1882. Both were members of the Baptist Church. Mr. Bullock married in 1871, Drusilla Finton, a native of this county, born in 1851. By this marriage five children have been born; viz.: Joseph, William, Edgar, Edith and Horner. In 1880 Mr. Bullock engaged in the saw-mill and basket business, employing some thirty-five hands. He has cut material for about 900,000 baskets this year up to date, and will cut about 5,000 more this fall. He and his wife are members of the Baptist Church."


Herman and Drusilla's oldest son, Joseph Finton Bullock went to Colgate University and became a District Superintendent of Schools in Yates County from 1912 to 1948. William Wallace Bullock also graduated from Colgate and went on to graduate school at Columbia

University; he was a school teacher and principal at several schools in New York State. Edgar Bullock went to West Virginia University and graduated as a mechanical engineer. The two daughters, Edith and Helen, and youngest son Homer did not receive college degrees. The photo to the right with Herman and three of his four sons was taken in the 1910s. From left: Joseph Finton, Herman, William Wallace, and Homer.



Around 1908, Herman and Drusilla bought land and went to live on the Isle of Pines, Cuba. The Bullock homestead in Crosby was bought by their son, William Wallace Bullock, and his wife, Alta Rae. During the first few years after 1908, the two youngest children, Homer and Helen, spent a good bit of time on the Isle of Pines with their parents and, when they were in the States, they were left in the care of their older brother, William. Helen lived with William and Alta in Hastings-on-the-Hudson, NY and graduated from high school there in 1914. Because of poor health, son Edgar came to live with his parents on the Isle of Pines. Herman, Edgar and H. A. Briggs built and operated a small fruit crate factory for a few years in the mid 1910's. In 1919, Edgar built and managed a large factory on the Isle of Pines that manufactured grapefruit crates. While living on the Isle of Pines, Herman and Drusilla made several trips back to the States, at least one per year, to visit their children.

In 1920, Herman and Drusilla came back to the States and lived with their daughter, Edith, and her husband Robert Elliott in Arlington, NJ. Herman died in 1924 while living with the Elliott's in Arlington. After Herman's death, Drusilla made at least on trip back to the Isle of Pines in 1926. Drusilla died in 1941 while living with Elliott's in Wycombe, Bucks County, PA. Herman and Drusilla are both buried in Dundee, Yates County, NY.





Penn Yan Newspaper Article on Joseph Finton Bullock

The town of Barrington was the birthplace of Joseph Finton Bullock on July 7, 1873. His father, Herman Bullock, a native of Barrington in 1848 and a manufacturer of baskets and fruit packages, married in 1873 Drusilla A. Finton, daughter of Joseph Finton, a pioneer farmer in Barrington. Joseph was the, first of their six children.

He was educated in the Barrington rural schools, Dundee High school, Keuka institute and Colgate University, receiving his B. S, degree from the latter in 1898. For a year he taught in a private school at Norwalk, Conn. then for a year entered the business with his



father. Continuing as a teacher he served in East Bloomfield as principal for a year and in Shortsville for two years before returning to Barrington and helping his father in business until 1907 when for five years he worked as a vineyardist on the shores of Lake Keuka. In 1911 he



was elected district superintendent of schools for the first supervisory district of the county, which position he has held to the present time.

In 1899 he married Katherine Worden, daughter of Rev. Alonzo T. Worden, Baptist minister of Ames, and deceased at the time of his daughter's marriage. They have six children: Elizabeth, born in 1900, the wife of Ralph W. Vaughn, instructor in the Penn Yan Public schools; Eugene, born in 1902, who now conducts a garage at Crosby; Francis, born in 1904, employed by the Dairymen's League, Penn Yan; Walter, born in 1906, now employed in the Strausenburgh Pharmaceutical Company, Rochester; Herbert, born in 1909, and Arthur Teall in 1917.

Mr. Bullock is a Republican, a member of the First Baptist church, and Rotary Club, the New York State Educational Association, of the Central association of district superintendents of the Ontario, Seneca and Yates association of district superintendents and of the Finger Lakes School Men's association.

In the three counties of Ontario, Seneca and Yates, Mr. Bullock is the only one of the original school superintendents who is still holding office."

J. F. Bullock Resigns Supervisory
School Position Held for 36 Years

In an unannounced move that comes as a surprise to practically everyone in Yates county, the state commissioner of education and the State Education department are consolidating all of the school districts of the county, outside of Penn Yan into one supervisory district. This comes on the heels of the resignation of Joseph F. Bullock, district superintendent of the first supervisory district for the past 36 years and eight months. The resignation which becomes effective Sept. 1 has not previously been announced.

Beginning Sept. 1, all of Yates county schools, except Penn Yan, including the Dundee Central school and the Middlesex Valley Central school, will be under the supervision of Stephen Underwood of Branchport, who for the past several years has served as superintendent of the second supervisory of the county.

Started Dundee Centralization

In speaking of his resignation, Mr. Bullock does not mention health as reason for his leaving his lifetime work, although he has been in ill health for the past several weeks. Always a progressive educator, Mr. Bullock is known familiarly in the southern part of the county as "father of the Dundee Central School." He was moving spirit in the organization of that central district, doing most of the basic work himself at a time when opposition to the change in the rural school districts was very strong.

Looking back over the years, Mr. Bullock comments that there has been a "tremendous change in teaching methods and in the methods of handling children." Supervised 52 Districts

"When I first started, there were 52 school districts including the Dundee Union Free School. Now there are 30 with the Dundee Central school district as one," says Mr. Bullock. When Mr. Underwood takes over the consolidated county district, there will again be just 52 districts, counting Dundee and Middlesex Valley as one each. The duties of the office have changed almost completely during the past 35 years, with new things added each year. Administrative duties have multiplied many times as administration and teaching methods are modernized

The administrative office of district superintendent has been static in the first supervisory district for so long that many folk have forgotten the normal procedure when a resignation such as Mr. Bullock's occurs. Under ordinary circumstances the school directors, of which there are supposed to be two in each township, elected by township vote, would be called together by the county clerk. After organizing, this group would then hire a new district superintendent to fill the vacancy. The board of supervisors has nothing to do with the employment of a candidate for this position.

School Directors Ignore Office

Candidates for the office of school directors have been on the ballots and duly elected when terms of office expired in the townships of Milo, Benton, Torrey, Starkey and Barrington, which make up the first supervisory district. The office has become so meaningless, however, that many candidates have not even bothered to take the oath of office. Although there has been no check made at this time, it is assumed that there are several vacancies in the 10 offices of school director in the five townships.

May Change Teachers Status

It is one of the prerogatives of the districts superintendent's office to okay and renew such teaching licenses as are not permanent. In the present shortage of teachers, with many women teaching on training class licenses first earned back before World War I and renewed from year to year, the supervisor of 52 districts has considerable veto power in his area. While all licenses

authorized by Mr. Bullock for the coming school year will be good during the coming nine months, a change in supervision might well mean a big change in the rural teaching personnel in Yates County next year.

Mr. Bullock, who was 75 on July 7 of this year, is the son of Herman and Drusilla Fenton Bullock pioneers in the Town of Barrington. He attended Barrington rural schools, Dundee high school, Keuka institute, and Colgate College, receiving his B. S. degree from the latter in 1898. For a year he taught in a private school at Norwalk, Conn., and then went into his father's business as a manufacturer of baskets and fruit packages.

Once Worked as Vineyardist

Returning to his favored career as a teacher, he served as principal at East Bloomfield for a year and at Shortsville for two years. Back again to Barrington he worked as a vineyardist for five years. In 1912 he was elected district superintendent of the first supervisory district. During his long term of service the State Department of Education has more than once pointed out Yates County as unique in the fact that it is the only one in the state where the principals of the high schools, the district superintendents, and some of the rural teachers have worked together on a program of studies.

Helped with New Study Courses

This method has eradicated the big break which generally comes in a child's life as he transfers from a rural school to a high school. By working together the teachers have correlated the courses of the one-room and the larger schools so that studies mesh without embarrassment to the child and have eliminated a long adjustment period previously part of the change between schools.

Mr. Bullock is a member of the State Teachers association, the New York State Association of District Superintendents, the Central New York District Superintendents association, the District Superintendents of Ontario, Yates, Seneca, and Wayne counties, the Grange, Farm Bureau, National Education association, Penn Yan Rotary club, and the First Baptist church of Penn Yan.



William Wallace Bullock

William Wallace Bullock was born 17 JUN 1875 in the town of Barrington, Yates County, NY the second child of Herman Bullock and Drusilla Asenith Finton He was named after his uncle William Wallace Finton, Drusilla's brother. In his younger days he worked with his Father at the Basket factory at their home at Crosby, as did all the Bullock boys, and with the portable saw mill. He attended Colgate University where he earned a Ph.B. degree in 1899. As an undergraduate, he was a member of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity. *The portrait of Uncle to the left was taken in about 1895*.

There is some question about how he wished to be addressed. Some of our cousins were gently reminded by our Uncle that he should be called "Uncle William". My Father, Homer, had always called him "Willy" and, naturally, Homer's children

grew up calling him that. Pete Bullock, the patriarch of the Bullock family, says that he and all his brothers called him "Uncle Willy" and, according to Pete, Uncle Joe called him either "Will" or "Willy." Because we don't want any disagreements or misunderstandings, I shall refer to him as "Uncle".

On 18 SEP 1901, Uncle married Alta Rae Cooley, of Canandaigua, NY. Of that wedding "The Penn Yan Democrat" reported: "Miss Cooley is one of the most charming of Canandaigua's society Young Ladies, and the congratulations and good wishes of a host of friends will follow her into her new home." After the wedding, the bride and groom set up housekeeping at Middlesex, N.Y where Uncle was Principal of the High School. Aunt Alta called him "Wallace." To this day, although we are working on it, we have not been able to pinpoint the dates and duration of Uncle's stay at Middlesex.

When Uncle was principal at Cuba, NY, Homer, his youngest brother, lived with Uncle and Alta and attended High School while their parents spent most of their time on the Isle of Pines, Cuba. We have been unable to learn when or how long Uncle was at Cuba, NY.

I have seen Palmyra, NY listed as a School where Uncle was Principal but we have so far been unable to verify it.

Uncle was Principal at Hastings-on-Hudson High School for one year (1912/1913) where he also taught Elementary Algebra. Helen Louise Bullock, Uncle's younger sister, lived with Uncle and Aunt Alta on Hillside Avenue and attended High School for two years graduating in 1914. Here she met her future husband, Hugh Ritchie Brown.

In 1913/1914, while still residing at Hastings, Uncle attended Columbia University which was only a short distance away. There he earned an A.M. degree from the University and a Masters Diploma in Education from Columbia Teachers College. I have heard my parents say that Uncle came within an inch of getting a Ph. D. while at Columbia. *The photo to the right of Alta and Uncle was probably taken in the 1930s*.

Here we lose contact with Uncle for a time. I feel that he went into industry during and for a few years after World War 1. I have heard my parents tell that Uncle worked in a Copper/Brass plant at Stamford, CT during WW1. Stamford is only a short distance from Hastings-on-Hudson; only about 20 miles as the crow flies.



A citation was given to Uncle: "William Wallace Bullock - War Department, Office of the Chief of Ordnance - faithfully served from Oct 21, 1918 to Dec 31, 1918." Where did he work and what did he do? We don't know!

I have on my dresser, a 2 ½ inch section from the butt end of a 75mm Artillery shell casing that was given to me by Uncle. It presumably came from his workplace during WW1. I keep coins in it. The obituary of Herman, Uncles father, in the Penn Yan Democrat of 20 JUN 1924 lists 4 sons as survivors. One was "W. W. Bullock from Stanford (sic) Conn." There is no Stanford but there is a Stamford, CT.

My son, Alan, sat down at my computer and, in less than 5 minutes, handed me the brochure of The Historical Society of Stamford, CT. From them I learned that Uncle had indeed been working at The Stamford Rolling Mills as an Accountant from 1922 to 1926. I have some leads which may provide more answers to Uncles activities and whereabouts during these times but at this time I am at a loss to tell more.



In very early 1927, Edgar was seriously ill at his home on the Isle of Pines and desperately needed assistance. Uncle volunteered to go down to help. The photo to the left above was taken on the Isle of Pines during Uncle's visit. Shown are: Mrs Dunham (Elizabeth's housekeeper), Elizabeth (Edgar's wife), Edith (Edgar and Elizabeth's daughter), and Uncle. I understand that Edgar's lungs were hemorrhaging and he had to lie on his

back without moving for two months. As a result of his experience with Herman's basket factory at Crosby, Uncle was able to take over and operate the mill until Edgar could be on his feet again. I remember the clothing he bought for the trip. First were the light tan leather boots

which laced to the knees. Then were the breeches that laced and tucked into the boot tops. They reminded me of those worn by the Canadian Mounties. I think he was concerned about the creepy crawlers that live close to the ground in the tropics. After Edgar was permitted to sit up, he rapidly regained his strength and he and his family were able to vacation in Western North Carolina that summer.

Uncle's last position as Principal was at Manchester High School which is now (1999) known as Red Jacket Central School. He was there from 1927/28 to 1935/36.

To enhance his pension after retiring from Manchester, Uncle took the teaching position at Milo #9 district School at Second Milo starting in the 1936/37 class year. That was the one-room school that I attended after returning from the Isle of Pines. While at Second Milo, Uncle boarded with Leon and Carrie Razey.

My first encounter with Uncle was at the time of Herman's funeral and took place at the Bullock homestead which he now owned at Crosby. A two-story building called "The Grape House" stood 100 feet or so north of the residence. I had great fun exploring that place. I had been building boats (Little kid boats as I was only 8). To support the boats while painting. I had driven small nails into his workbench. That bench was far from pristine but Uncle came by one day and made it very clear to me that nails are not to be driven into his workbench. The photo to the right, taken in the 1910s, shows Edgar Bullock, Phil Bullock, Helen Bullock, and Homer Bullock standing in front of "The Grape House" at the Bullock homestead in Crosby, NY.



Uncle was very fastidious, bordering on "fussy". He drove a beautiful, huge Reo Flying Cloud automobile and no one, and I mean <u>NO ONE</u>, but his Nephew, Gene Bullock, was permitted to touch it! My neighbor reminds me of Uncle. He has a new BMW motorcycle and after riding for hours over all kinds of roads, an hour or so after returning you cannot find one speck of dust on that cycle!


After my graduation from High School, Uncle took me aside and offered to loan me the money to attend College. To make long story short, I refused the offer. That was one of the big mistakes of my life, but I didn't have the nerve to go back to him and tell him: "I've changed my mind."

I didn't see much of Uncle and Aunt Alta, but when they visited, I had the impression that they were dressed to the gills! Aunt Alta wore fancy, delicate leather shoes on her tiny feet, and a Fox around her neck. I was fascinated by that fox! It was real, complete with teeth and claws. Uncle wore what looked to me to be the finest suits, overcoats, and hats. I felt out of

place with them. After Aunt Alta died in 1937, Uncle seemed to become a different man, much more human and likeable.

For a time, Homer was superintendent of the Sunday School at The Second Milo Baptist Church. He invited Uncle to recite "The Gettysburg Address" at a Memorial Day program one year. He did an excellent job and he received compliments from many. The portrait of Uncle, to the right, was probably taken in the 1930s.

In his retirement years, Uncle did a great deal of work around his home at Crosby. The more obvious were 1) The Grape House was torn down and 2) and a 3-car garage was built backing up to the vineyard and facing directly down the driveway to the road. I questioned the need of a 3-car garage but it was a 2-story building with a spacious loft above for his shop. He had plenty of room for all his tools, both hand and machine, with space left over for supplies and raw materials.



Over the years, he made probably hundreds of pieces of furniture. His attention to the minute details was still with him; his pieces were first rate. If you picked up a piece of wood in his shop, Uncle could tell you exactly where and when he acquired that piece. How many of us can do that?

I believe that Uncle was a lonely man. On 14 JUL 1942 he married Harriet Van Arsdale of Manchester. She had been one of his teachers when he was Principal at Manchester.

After Uncle's marriage to Harriet, they set up housekeeping in a small house at the Van Arsdale farm. I have heard that one of Harriet's sisters made life difficult for him but I know nothing of the details. As a result, Uncle built a small building for use as a shop at the rear of the drive at the Van Arsdale farm. I recall Homer, Calvin, Paul and I going over to assist him. Bob was in the Navy at the time and couldn't be there! Shortly after its completion, the shop was moved to Holcomb and set up directly behind and perhaps 200 feet away from Homers shop.

Uncle then moved some of his machinery and tools into the shop. Uncle and Harriet rented an apartment, at the home of Ray Barden, which was across the street from Homer's place. All this took place in 1945/1946.

I remained with Homer in his shop until 1948. During this time, Uncle and I became well acquainted, and I liked and respected him and, I felt the feeling was mutual.

He spent a portion of his time, usually weekends, at Crosby and the rest at Holcomb. I went to see him at Crosby one evening to ask his advice. He was very gracious and friendly with me. He invited me into his den and closed the door. We sat at his big double desk and discussed my problem. The problem was not solved, but he gave it a try!

Many people suffer from hay fever and Uncle was very sensitive to it. Every year he was forced to flee to the Adirondack Mountains for relief. Each year he came back a new man!

Uncle's brother, Homer, died in July 1957. Uncle laid down his tools 7 months later. I was 42 years of age when we lost Uncle. I feel that I was privileged to know him and I have missed him!

Note: I have used first names in many cases. If this offends you I pray you'll forgive me.



Edgar Bullock and Elizabeth Hermine Rahmig

Edgar Bullock was born in 1878 in Crosby, Town of Barrington, Yates County, NY, the son of Herman and Drusilla Bullock. The photo to the right was taken when Edgar was a teenager. In 1904, after graduating from West Virginia University with a BS degree in Mechanical Engineering, he took a job with Westinghouse Electric Corporation at their East Pittsburgh, PA plant. His sister, Edith Mary Bullock, came to the Pittsburgh area to care for Edgar when he became ill. While there, she met her future husband, Robert Truman Elliott; Robert also graduated from WVU and was a co-worker of Edgar's at Westinghouse. Because of poor health, after a few years at Westinghouse, he moved to Phoenix, Arizona. Sometime after 1910, he went to live on the Isle of Pines. Cuba where his father and mother had purchased land for a retirement home. Soon after he arrived, Edgar, Herman and H. A. Briggs built a small fruit crate factory near Herman's home in the town of Santa Fe. Herman had, for many years, owned and operated a grape basket factory and lumber mill along Keuka Lake in



Crosby, Yates County, NY. In about 1918, Edgar was hired by a Senor Milian to build and manage the Pine-Box Factory whose major customer was The West Indies Fruit Importing Co. of Chicago for pineapple crates.

Elizabeth Hermine Rahmig was born in 1890 in Hamburg, Germany the daughter of Karl



and Johanna Brede Rahmig. The Rahmig family came to New York from Germany in May of 1901 and settled in the borough of Queens. In the late 1910's, she came to Havana, Cuba to work for Senor Milian. She visited the Isle of Pines where Senor Milian was building the Pine-Box Factory and, while on the visit, she met the plant manager, Edgar Bullock.

Edgar and Elizabeth were married in 1919 at the home of his sister and her husband, Robert and Edith Elliott, in Arlington, NJ. *The photo to the left above*

was taken at the Bullock homestead in Crosby, NY while they were on their brief honeymoon. They then went back to the Isle of Pines where they lived twenty more years. Elizabeth worked at the Pine-Box Factory as an accountant. Their daughter, Edith May Bullock was born in Santa Fe, Isle of Pines, Cuba in 1921. Elizabeth and Edith are shown in the photo to the right.



Edgar managed the Pine-Box Factory and other crate factories on the Isle of Pines until his death in 1939. The following is a quote from a 1918 newspaper article in the Isle of Pines Appeal. "It was, the

writer believes, at the Briggs mill some years ago that the system of 'cooking' the logs for veneer was first employed the method being introduced by Mr. Edgar Bullock and his father, then in the employ of Mr. Briggs. The same method on a larger scale is now one of interesting features of the great mill at Abra Grande. The superintendent of this beehive of industry in the hollow behind Monte La Luisa is Mr. Edgar Bullock, a person with two unusual traits. He seldom sleeps and he always smiles." *The photo below is of one of the crate factories he managed*.



Edgar died at the home of the Elliott's in Wycombe, Bucks County, PA. Elizabeth worked in New York City for several years before she retired to live with her daughter, Edith, and her family in Wilmore, Kentucky.

Daughter Edith graduated with a BA degree from Houghton College, Houghton, NY in 1942. She married Dale Edward Dunkleberger in 1943. After Dale received his MD, they settled in Kentucky where Dale was a family

physician. They have three daughters. Elizabeth Hermine Rahmig Bullock died in 1983 in Lexington, KY at the age of 92. Both Edgar and Elizabeth are buried in Wrightstown, PA.

Elizabeth Bullock's Memoirs

The following excerpts from Elizabeth Hermine Rahmig Bullock's memoirs give some insight into the Bullock's life on the Isle of Pines. The excerpts are in quotes and her daughter Edith May Bullock Dunkleberger's comments are in parentheses. The photo below is of the Bullock home on the Isle after the storm of 1926; note the trees with broken limbs and missing leaves. Their home was one of the very few buildings left standing.

"Edgar's father was one of many in western New York who bought land on the Isle of Pines having in mind the healthful climate for Edgar who was then living in Arizona because of its dry climate. Edgar's older brothers, Joe and William Wallace and sister Edith were married and not living at home. The younger ones, Homer and Helen, came with



their parents to the Isle of Pines and all helped in building the home and starting a grapefruit grove. It takes 5 years or more for a grove to bear fruit which means much labor and money invested before any return can be expected. I have a picture of Homer plowing with their mule.

Helen taught in the American school in Santa Fe. They went back to Keuka Lake to avoid the hot summer rainy season but Edgar stayed. He had a small crate mill and sold his product locally. He always had a vegetable garden and he made beautiful sturdy furniture using the many hard woods of the island. In Arizona he had worked as a cabinet maker. These fruits of his labor were in the house when I got there: flat top desk, library table, bookcase, rocking chair, big straight chair, 4-poster bed, etc. All of plain design to suit the house, beautifully made and finished with many coats of shellac which let the natural grain shine through." (I do not know what year this was.)

(My mother continues after telling of the storm of 1926.) ".... after Christmas Edgar got men to help him raise that corner of the kitchen." (that fell off the foundation during the storm). "And then, the first of the new year what he had always feared happened. There was blood, just a little, but it meant a hemorrhage of the lungs. He had to stay in bed, flat on his

back, and not move. His brother
William Wallace came to run the mill.
He too had experience in his father's
grape basket mill. Mrs. Durham of
Columbia consented to be our house
keeper. The photo to the right is of Mrs.
Durham, Elizabeth, Edith and William
Wallace. Edgar's condition did not
get worse, at least there were no outward
signs of it. For 2 months he lay there
quietly, submissively, on his back, not
daring to move. Dr. Llorca looked in on
him at least twice a week. There was no
pain but always the fear that the



condition might worsen any time. When he was permitted to sit up part-time he gained strength and was soon back on his job at the mill, half time." (Soon they were planning to spend the summer in western North Carolina.)

"After the Oct. 20, 1926 cyclone all incidents were dated as before or after "the storm". The biggest loss to the island was its trees. Soon the pine trees near La Ceiba were used up. Edgar learned that there were pines at La Siguanea but that they were small in diameter. He then sent a Warfield to estimate the number. He over-estimated resulting in the company paying much more than they were worth. And Oskar Schneider, the agent, was rewarded with an unmerited large commission."

"Before the heavy machinery, especially the big boiler, could be transported the 20 miles between La Ceiba and La Siguanea the trail had to be straightened, widened and 17 bridges built. Mill buildings with workmen's places to live were erected also a fairly large house for us so Edgar would not have travel that long road. The workmen bothered him so much with family problems especially at night that he could not rest properly and he moved back to our house in Santa Fe and he drove out to the mill only 2-3 times a week." (When I lived in La Siguanea it was so far from any people and Christmas was coming. I was so worried that Santa would not find me out there. BUT HE DID.)

Edgar Bullock Obituary

DEATH OF EDGAR BULLOCK, Barrington Native, Isle of Pines Resident, Edgar Bullock, aged 61, a native of the Town of Barrington, Yates County, but for the past 30 years a resident of the Isle of Pines, Cuba, died Thursday, October 5, 1939 at the home of his sister, Mrs. Robert T. Elliott, Wycombe, PA, He was a son of Herman and Drusilla Bullock, and spent his boyhood at their home on the East Lake Road, south of Penn Yan. Mr. Bullock was an honor graduate of Colgate Academy and in 1904 received both arts and engineering degrees from the University of West Virginia. For two years until his health failed, he was with the Westinghouse Corporation at Pittsburgh. While retaining citizenship in Yates County, he was for several years engaged in the manufacture of fruit and vegetable packages in the Isle of Pines, both as manager and as an independent owner. He will be long remembered by the poorer people of the Isle of Pines, both Spanish and colored English-speaking groups, for his evangelical and rehabilitation work among them, as well as for his employment of and other assistance to hundreds after the great storm of 1926. He was for nearly 50 years a member of the Lake Keuka Baptist Church. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Elizabeth Rahmig Bullock a daughter, Edith; his mother, Mrs. Drusilla Bullock of Wycombe, PA; two sisters, Mrs. Robert T. Elliott of Wycombe and Mrs. Hugh R. Brown of Hastings-on-Hudson; and three brothers, Joseph and William of Penn Yan and Homer of East Bloomfield. Burial was made in Wrightstown, PA, Monday afternoon.

From a Lexington, KY newspaper At 78, Local Woman Becomes Landscape Artist, Finds She's Good At It

Lexington. KY, Thursday, Sept. 27 1973

Following a lifetime of careers' as businesswoman, translator, wife, mother, education secretary and aide, Elizabeth Bullock is providing a sequel to the Grandma Moses story. The local artist says she just likes to keep busy.

You'd never know at first glance that her life had been one of excitement and travel and that after 20 years on the Isle of Pines, south of Havana, she at last has found contentment in a Lexington apartment.

She's a petite woman, but a stubborn set to her mouth indicates a determination that, coupled with an adventurous heart, has taken her around the world and at age 78 put an artist's brush in her hand and started her on the road to turning out 120 oil landscapes.

Mrs. Elizabeth Bullock currently is having an exhibition of her work at Shackleton's on East Main, Lexington, but she's not around to enjoy comments about her talent. She's oft on a two-week trip through the Pacific Northwest with Donavems - senior citizens of UK.

Two months ago she was discouraged by the lack of sales for her paintings. "I have painted and painted," she said. "Should I paint more?"

"You were given the talent," offered an artist friend, "which means you must use it for good. Don't you know that soon your work will start selling."

Then, this month she received a check for the second landscape in oil she recently sold to the First Federal Savings & Loan Association. "Of course, that makes me very happy," she noted. What does she paint? Landscapes of the many places she has visited and lived and, of course, Kentucky scenes. And her style? As her business background will testify, she goes about her painting with precision because for now at least, her work is a reasonable facsimile of her subject. If she is doing a scene of Cumberland Falls, it's readily apparent. If it's a scene on

the Rhine River captured during a visit there, the work is so authentic in its color and surroundings that it is completely recognizable.

There is much about her work that today is defined as "primitive" but in any era can also it be defined as "truth." There is an over-all straightforwardness in her scenes that contributes much to their charm.

Began In Business - As a young girl she entered competitive examination and earned a year's tuition in a highly rated Brooklyn, N. Y. business college and later became office manager of an export-import leather house in New York.

"I enrolled in Spanish at New York University. Two years before we became involved in World War I the leather house business had slowed to a crawl and since I could not bear to draw a. good salary for doing nothing, I decided to go to Cuba and apply my Spanish." Arriving at customs at the dock in Havana she was disenchanted to learn that neither she nor customs officers could understand one word of the practical spoken Spanish!

In Cuba she ate beefsteak twice a day until she learned to say more than "bifstek."

She became English stenographer for United Railways and when the manager resigned she was assigned his position. Along with the job came a pass that allowed free rail travel. She took advantage of it and soon traveled to the Isle of Pines in the Caribbean. The beautiful island was only 30 by 40 miles and was considered United States territory after being ceded by Spain after the Spanish-American War.

Settles On Island - I met my future husband on the Isle of Pines. He was an engineer and had built and was managing a large pineapple crate mill that employed about 100 men. We lived on this beautiful health spot for more than 20 years.

It was in March 1925 that the U. S. Congress gave the Isle to Cuba. "The next year the worst hurricane in the history of the island leveled it - houses, trees, everything. The mill buildings had been blown away or damaged. My husband worked overtime to reconstruct it and as a result his health failed and later he succumbed."

Back in Philadelphia at the advent of World War II she did her part in the great Victory Bond effort by addressing labels. She later was told that from the time she started working with the labels the entire project worked smoothly and efficiently.

Mrs. Bullock later was secretary to Dr. Helen Dwight Reid, director of the European Division of Higher Education for the U. S. Office of Education. "At the forming of the charter of the United Nations in San Francisco, Dr. Reid was one of five women consultants. The implementation of teaching about the charter in schools in the United States was entrusted to her and once a year she and I as her secretary fashioned the report to the United Nations from the United States of what had been accomplished."

After World War II Mrs. Bullock started working with young people, principally with German and American youths who wanted to gain a better understanding of the other. This was through the Pen Pal Project for Better International Understanding. She studied the many letters, trying to decipher the ones written in old-style German script. She finally had to take some of the work home. At one time, she counted 1,000 letters on her desk for her reading and answering.

"Eighth Army Headquarters, Presidio, San Francisco, was feverishly hiring additional civilian help in preparation for a flareup in the Korean conflict. I was hired to speed up mail from home to our troops when the eruption came. It never came, so there I was getting paid again for doing nothing."

Still Another Career - She finally convinced her boss that she had more important things to do. "I was desperately needed at Oak Knoll Navy Hospital because of the many amputees coming in from Korea."

This work proved the most satisfying of all her endeavors. "The chief orthopedist of the Navy had been transferred from Bethesda, Md., and I became his secretary. I knew German and he was translating a German textbook on fractures for use by Navy doctors."

She was eager to start work on Volume II of the textbook translations when word came that the Austrian author needed to first revise it.

"Consternation seized me! That meant nothing but routine work for at least six months or maybe a year. I had received a raise, but even so I knew there were things in the world that needed doing. I resigned." She traveled for several months. Her daughter and physician husband and family loved to Wilmore and Mrs. Bullock left for four months in Europe. Back in the U. S. she worked as secretary in the office of a Baptist weekly in New York City.

To Lexington - From Miami, Fla., Mrs. Bullock came to Lexington. That was only six years ago, but already she has made friends throughout the area. She was afraid of failure when someone suggested she take art lessons through the Senior Citizens in Lexington. But with the same determination that pushed her from easy jobs to doing something worthwhile with her life, - she started painting - and she hasn't stopped except for travel. She is a member of both the Lexington Art League and Blue Grass Artists Association.

Is it any wonder that she is exact in her style and that she can paint a range of subjects? At an age in life when some souls take to a rocking chair and stare into space, Elizabeth Bullock picked up a paintbrush to continue a development that began many years ago in New York.

This is an artist whose work can be examined more closely, seeing with eyes that take in the entire spectrum of her life.

was a teenager. Robert Truman Elliott was born in 1877 in West Virginia the son of Samuel and Bashie Elliott. The Elliott's were farmers and lived in Clay District, Harrison County, WV in 1880. Robert was working as a coal miner in Fayetteville, WV in 1900. A few years later, after graduating from the University of West Virginia, he was working for Westinghouse Electric Corporation in East Pittsburgh, PA.

After graduating from West Virginia University in 1904, Edith's brother Edgar worked at the East Pittsburgh, PA plant of Westinghouse Electric Corporation and while there met fellow employee Robert Elliott. Edith came to the Pittsburgh area to care for Edgar when he became ill and while there met Robert. Edith and Robert were married in 1909 at the Bullock homestead in Crosby.

Edith and Robert first lived in Brooklyn, NY where he was employed at a shipyard. Later they lived in Arlington, NJ for several years. *The photo to the right below shows Edith and Robert at their Arlington home.* While at Arlington, the Elliotts opened their home in 1919 for the wedding of Edgar Bullock and Elizabeth Rahmig; Edgar met Elizabeth on the Isle of Pines, Cuba. In 1920, Herman, Drusilla, and daughter Helen were living with the Elliott's in Arlington. Herman died at the Elliott home in 1924.



Sometime between 1926 and 1931 the Elliotts bought a farm, with a large old stone farmhouse, in Wycombe, Bucks County, PA. At that time Robert and Edith became farmers. Drusilla lived there with them until she died in 1941. Edith's sister, Helen, and her family lived at the farm, with the Elliott's, from 1949 to 1964. Helen took care of Edith in the 1960s when she was gravely ill. Both Edith and Robert died in 1963 and they are buried in Wrightstown, PA.

Life on the Elliott Farm in Wycombe, PA

Excerpts of two letters from **Drusilla Asenith Finton Bullock** to her daughter-in-law, Mary Florence Rector Bullock, dated March 19, 1931 and December 6, 1931 give some insight into life on the farm. Drusilla was living with the Elliotts and Mary was living in Waterloo, NY. The photo below is of Robert and Edith taken in the mid 1940's in front of their Bucks County farm house.

"..... Helen (Helen Louise Bullock Brown, Drusilla's other daughter) wants me to come over there and Edith said they would take me but there don't seem to be any time. It's either a sick cow or a new calf that keeps them home. There was another new calf this morning. They lost their best cow they had; one he paid 400 dollars for. She had swallowed a nail or piece of wire. They don't know when, but all last year she had a cough and the man who looks after the cows said she had T. B. But they tested her and did not find she had it. But the man was determined to report her but Robert wouldn't let him do it. But went and got a Dr. and he said it

was something she had swallowed and that proved to be true. She died just before she was to come in. It was a hard blow for them. And now the milk is cheaper and they wont take only so many pounds. The rest is surplus and that brings 3 cents and they pay ½ cent for getting it to market. The hens don't lay as well as they did last year and eggs are so cheap. And they are what they depend



on for their living. They are pretty discouraged. I am glad that Homer has a job. There are so many out of work. A man who worked here a year ago came back and wanted to stay a while and work for his board. He has been here six weeks and don't say anything about going away. He surely earns his board. Edith does his washing. She is making her own bread now. It is a saving and we like it. But its lots more work. He came from a trade school and is waiting to get a position. He has red curly hair. Some of the girls would give all their old shoes if their hair would wave like his. The more it rains the prettier it is."

"..... There was a little calf the day you left and another the next day. But they both went to the butcher. It seemed too bad. I wish the little boys could have seen the cows and horses. Robert has bought the blind horse since you were here. He had taken it to work for its board this winter and the man wanted Robert to buy it. And he had to have a horse so he bought it cheap. We had out Thanksgiving dinner alone. Had a chicken and it was the fattest thing you ever saw. And we had pumpkin pie and mince pie, both very good. The day before we made a kettle of mince meat and I wished you could have had some of it. I wish you could have had it to make pie to sell for Christmas. If I was up there I would make some for you. I think it was about the best I ever ate. We canned 22 pumpkins the first week I was here and 8 jars of pears that someone brought. And a lot of little pears that Robert picked. They were just common fruit pickery like choke cherries but made good sauce cooked whole. How did Philip like his jam? I

am glad he is doing so well in school; some day Ruth will be there. Edith says the jar of mince meat she gave you is for Homer's Christmas dinner and the jar of gooseberrys, not marked, are just canned are not jam."

Life on the Elliott Farm in Wycombe, PA

The following was excerpted, with permission, from an April 13, 1999 letter written by **Edith Ellen Brown McCormick** to me (Paul Bullock). It is presented here because of its vivid descriptions of life on the farm. The photo below is of the Brown children; Peggy, Malcolm, Edith, and Bruce at the Elliott farm. The photo of the Elliott farmhouse on the next page was taken in the 1980s by Peggy Brown Call.

"My personal earliest memory was of Uncle Robert's coming to the house with newborn twin calves. I suppose Aunt Edith had to help them, or perhaps Uncle Robert just wanted the children to see them. I remember walking up the lane with him; it was 1934! And I was 4.

I remember when milk brought 4 cents a pound, and we'd bring in the cows from the lower pasture, with Jim (he must have returned) at 4:30 a. m. to have them fed and milked by hand, the milk cooled in freshly drawn water in the tank in the milk house, then poured



in cans and put on the milk wagon, hitching the horse, and driving the half mile to Wycombe by 7:00. After the dairy man would reject the milk when it was too warm and we'd take it all home to drink and make cottage cheese! It's too bad that Uncle Robert, who was a great farmer, didn't know enough physics to have understood how to cool the milk further, or at least to have protected it from warming up in those crucial moments. In the ten years since we bought this farm I've thought over and over of things Uncle Robert taught me. He was brilliant.

Jim milked very fast; he was small and strong; he didn't talk while he worked. Aunt Edith gave him a very nice bedroom, and spent Christmas with us. He earned \$1 a day, room / board, and went to the hotel every Saturday night. After Jim left for good, "Tommy Gail" and various scatterbrained farm hands kept the farm going. I performed most of the chores except for milking more than one cow at once. I drove the horses alone or with U. R. in the fields, and did the mow work while he loaded the fork. Malcolm knew enough not to come to the farm for summers, and Peggy was considered frail, so she played. I loved my role and gave it all the strength I had. Now that education is precisely what I need here. Eventually Peggy drove the hay rake horse, while I put the hay in corners of the mow.

Because Aunt Edith is your blood relative, perhaps some of her traits will be interesting to you. All of the brothers were brilliant and formally-educated; the sisters were intelligent also, and studied informally. Aunt Edith could have been a physicist. She loved mathematics,

precision and cause-and-effect relationships. Grandma mentions the quality of her cooking in two places, at least, in those letters. Aunt Edith measured by weight all of her ingredients, adding the totals of the ounces and fractions as she assembled them. She explained to me the various kinds of wheat and where they were grown, and said that the relationship between the weight of the flour and its volume depended on the humidity the day it was packed!! So when a bag of flour was new, she measured the volume before weighing it for a recipe. I was fascinated by that, and never considered it redundant. I knew it was essential if she did it. She was

preparing me for my pre-med career. When she needed a weather forecast she'd go to the porch, study the wind direction and speed, the clouds' form and movement, and explain to me what was happening and what weather was coming. If it was going to be severe, she'd send me running to close and lock all of the shutters. She sensed the coming of the tornado that destroyed Mr. Naylor's buildings and protected us.



She raised her vegetable plants in trays and explained the varieties and why she

grew them. She sold strawberries which I picked and had an egg business; I retailed them on my bike all through high school. So the eggs which were supporting them during Grandma's stay there were still helping out in 1947! She weighed every egg, of course, before packing them to ship to me. She charged me the farm market price every week, and it was up to me to make my profit. It wasn't much.

Here is a prayer with which Uncle Robert ended their evening worship every night, after the Scripture reading, while kneeling on that cold slate kitchen floor, at the farm we all loved, so much:

GIVE US REST,
WE PRAY THEE,
IN SLEEP,
THAT WILL FIT US FOR WHATEVER
THOU DOST HAVE FOR US
ON THE MORROW."

The following was written by Margaret Drusilla Brown Call and is used here with her permission.

THE FARM by Peggy Brown Call

We had to cross two rivers. We kids were packed in closely in the back seat. There was always a discussion with the driver whether we would take the Holland or the Lincoln Tunnel from Hastings-on-Hudson in NY State, through New Jersey on our way to Bucks County, Pennsylvania. I loved those tunnels. How could any man-made construction hold back that mighty river above? Our headlights reflected on the shiny white tiles on the walls as they flew by. Often there would be a maintenance man walking on the raised walkway which ran along the side above the level of the road. I puzzled about why he was there and wondered how long he would have to stay down there under the flowing water of the Hudson River. What would he do if the tunnel sprang a leak? What would we all do? And then all of the sudden we would see the light of the New Jersey sky in the opening in front of us. But the New Jersey air on the Pulaski Skyway was polluted, gray and stinky. We pinched closed our noses with one hand as we wound up the windows with the other.

We impatiently anticipated these trips each summer as soon as school was out because we were headed to my Aunt Edith and Uncle Robert's Cherry Lane Farm, which we always referred to as simply 'The Farm.' By the time we crossed the little bridge over the Delaware River into the artist's colony of New Hope we knew we were close. The scenery changed immediately. The gaudy road signs of New Jersey, advertising everything you could imagine, disappeared. Here the country side was green and lush with corn, alfalfa and wheat bending in the breeze. Cows grazed here and there. The old farm houses were built of beautiful stone, some a yellowish red and some a deep creek-bed red stone. I wondered about many things. How did the builders 'way back then' haul all of those stones? How long did it take to construct the windows and make those wavy panes of glass? Many of these beautiful houses were pre-Revolutionary War. George Washington had slept at an inn made of the same stone up in Buckingham, just a few miles away. At least that's the way the story goes.

But the house on Cherry Lane Farm surpassed them all. This farm was the best place for children and Aunt Edith and Uncle Robert didn't have any. That may be the main reason that we went there every summer. They needed help and we, all five of us were kept busy. Aunt Edith was 16 years older than my mother. She replaced the grandmother that I had hardly known.

As we turned the corner at the Buggy Wheel we only had minutes more to wait. We could see the barn first with its bull pen, enclosed barn yard, milk house, the shed which protected the 1936 Dodge and some of the farm machinery. Then the corn crib came into view; all of these buildings to the left of the long red hued lane -- and there it was set back farther from the road-the beautiful red stone house with its four chimneys, three front doors, white shutters, and flagstone porch. The walls were 12 inches thick. There were two huge maples, and two larger sycamore trees with their white speckled trunks and hanging pompoms spread in a line across the front lawn, the old walnut tree in the side yard, the lilac bush and another maple tree just at the back corner.

Aunt Edith came out to the porch to hug us all. She must have pulled off her apron and flung it over a chair when she heard us drive in. We entered the screened door from the flagstone porch,

into the flagstone paved kitchen. But these stones in the kitchen had been washed for two hundred years and were black and shiny. The slanted door to the cellar served as our favorite slide. The tree trunk beams overhead held their secrets. Above them was the original smoke house. We didn't pay much attention to the open chute built into the stone wall of the kitchen. It was made of matching flat stone passing through the wall where it protruded about ten inches outside on the side of the house. In the absence of plumbing it was used by the early owners to get rid of dirty dish water without going outside. We learned years later when the house was declared a historical site that this chute is unique to this house. The present owners have been told that there is not another like it in the whole United States.

I was afraid to go down cellar as it was a dark, shadowy, damp place even in the summer. The floor was unpaved and the ground was slippery. But the temperature made it ideal for all of the food stored there on the shelves, rows upon rows of canned peaches, pears, applesauce, tomatoes, elderberries, blackberries and endless rows of vegetables which Aunt Edith and Mother had canned. And of course we kids had played our part in their preparation. We had picked the strawberries and peeled the peaches. We had climbed the trees and picked the cherries. This was, after all, Cherry Lane Farm. Aunt Edith had a hand-turned pitter.

All of the rooms were laid out in a line. You could walk in one of the front doors, cross the room and go out into the backyard. Each room, upstairs and down, had its own fire place. A child could easily stand up straight in the two which included bakeovens. There were two staircases. Perhaps the early owners had built one two-story section at a time and added the next as the farm prospered.

Aunt Edith and Mother also canned the chickens which Uncle Robert slaughtered in the side yard. The slaughtered pigs provided hams and bacon and our version of Philadelphia Scrapple. Every so often Aunt Edith would serve us a slice of fried scrapple for breakfast or even supper. Morning coffee was served fresh ground. The hand turned grinder, already an antique, was attached to the door of the kitchen pantry. I can still hear the sound of that grinder.

If I was afraid of the dark cellar, I loved the attic. There were only two small windows at either end. The sloping slate roof meant that we could stand up in the center but only there. The attic was divided by the chimneys. Otherwise it was one big room with the openings of the two staircases rising from the second floor. There were no railings around them to protect someone from taking a wrong step. In one section the hams and bacon hung. Aunt Edith would climb the two flights, choose the one she wanted, go back down to the kitchen, slice off just enough and hike the remainder back up to the attic. I can't remember that she ever asked us to save her a few steps.

There was a lot for little girls to play with. The trunks were full of dresses from the 1800's complete with bustles and huge hats with feathers from tropical birds. But as I recall the dresses were all too small for us to climb into. My mother kept the hair trunk of photos. It had her initials on the cover - HLB in brass. There was still another trunk almost full of letters from family living in Cuba, among those from other relatives, but I can't imagine who they all were from. To my knowledge I never opened one to read it. I wouldn't have done that without permission and it didn't occur to me to ask. My deepest regret is that those letters were disposed of when the house was sold. Imagine the surprises and history they contained. The dresses and hats were sent to the Mercer Museum in Doylestown, the county seat.

One day my sister and I crawled under the bed in my aunt and uncle's bedroom. I think that we were sleeping in there that summer. We found a cloth padded box. We sneaked a peek. In it were lots of old coins. Some of them were pure gold and unless my memory fails me were dated in the 1850's. Opening that box was probably a secret that we kept to ourselves.

The most vivid memories were outside: running back and forth from the barn to the house in the pouring rain with burlap bag capes on our heads; the arrival for the summer of the Stackhouse family with their children, David and Katherine, and sometimes their cousins, playing hide and seek in the dark with the kids from Wycombe village who came the 3/4's of a mile after supper to play with us, catching lightning bugs in jars and letting them go before they died, sleeping on the front lawn and then being awakened way too early when Uncle Robert let Toby out of the barn. He made a beeline to the front lawn to lick every cheek in sight.

We played house or hospital by the hour in a parked hackney. It was black with four huge wheels and a black canvas roof, and steps to make it easy for the ladies to climb up into. Uncle Robert used it to deliver milk until he got his 1936 Dodge. We had a neighbor who sat in his two wheel hackney and often drove his beautiful trotting horse in front of the farm on his way into Wycombe. I imagined him as a country gentleman that I had read about in books like "Black Beauty." When Uncle Robert retired his, he had parked it under the trees on the far side of the house.

Sometimes in the evenings we would just run in the dark, across the roads up the hills down along the creek. One night I was lagging behind the larger group and didn't see them all duck as they ran under the electrified barbed wire fence. It caught me on my right shoulder. I carried the scar for years.

When the hay was high in the barn we could reach the rafters to capture the squabs (baby pigeons) whose nests were on the crossbeams. There was always a pair. We put them in chicken cages, fed them with our fingers trying to dupe them into thinking they were their mother's beak. We watched their hairy bodies change to feathers and then tried to teach them to fly. Their mother knew how that should be done but we were ignorant of her techniques. We put them on the clothes line and let them go, hoping that as they fell they would stretch their wings out. They followed us around sometimes riding on our shoulders. Uncle Robert helped us name them: Kate and Duplicate, Pete and Repeat, Nip and Tuck, Jack and Jill.

From time to time in the evening some neighbor would stop by and report that our heifers were out of their pasture. Uncle Robert sent us to remedy the situation. One night someone took a picture as we trudged up the hill. We were kind of lined up according to size with Toby, a cat and David's pet pig trailing behind. A neighbor had given David the runt of his litter which without very special care would have died. David cared for him like a baby and he became a hanger-on in a lot of our activities.

But the main reason we were there was to help with the farm work. No one kept a diary so there is no way to know how many days we spent in the fields or in the barn. Suffice it to say that some summers Uncle Robert did not employ a hired hand. The fields had already been fertilized, plowed, harrowed and planted by the time we arrived. But very shortly haying would start. Maintaining 80 acres, with about 15 to 20 cows to be milked by hand twice a day, the pigs and chickens to be fed and watered and the hay and alfalfa to be cut and stored and the corn to be

ground and the feed to be mixed, there was plenty to do to say nothing of the back breaking work of cleaning up after the animals. At least in the summer they spent their days in the pastures.

We didn't go out to the barn at 4:30 in the morning to do the milking but we had our tasks around the afternoon milking and then there were the chickens to water and care for and the eggs to be gathered. I was in charge of the chickens. That old hen who insisted on setting on her egg created some extra drama during my forays into the coop. I was so afraid to put my hand under her and steal her egg because she would peck at me with all her might, that I would stand in front of her, talk to her - and pray.

I also was the driver of the horses, in the hay field as well as the single horse which pulled the hay fork loading the hay from the wagon into the mow and to the mill in town. On the return trip I would just drop the reigns and let them take us home. Edith, who was two years older than I, had tasks which were much more strenuous. She stacked the hay on the wagon and in the mow as Uncle Robert guided the huge fork which heaved it up. She ran the mower and probably other heavy machines. One day my brother Bruce came to the barn to watch all of the activity. He was four years younger than I so was very young. He was standing to the side but unfortunately had one leg straddling the rope as I started driving the horse down the incline. The rope jerked up and caught him just behind the knee tearing a good section of flesh from behind the joint.

I fell in love with the horses. These were tired, worn out discarded work horses with stocky legs that had delivered milk along the cobblestone streets of Philadelphia. Uncle Robert was able to buy them for a song. They gradually regained their strength in the country air and gave years of service. I would stand under their soft velvety noses petting them and talking to them when I was alone. Uncle Robert's cows were all registered Holsteins. He asked me to reproduce the black and white colorings on their registration papers. In order to be sure my design was correct I would climb up into the hay mow to look at their backs from above. They looked so different from up there with their fat bellies shooting out on both sides.

Uncle Robert was a devout Christian. He believed whole heartedly that man should imitate the pattern of working six days a week and resting on Sunday. Even if rain was coming on a Monday he would not take the horses out haying on Sunday. They needed to rest as much as he did. But that didn't mean that the milking could be laid aside or that all of the animals didn't need to be fed. We also had a Bible reading all together in the kitchen each night. I always chose my seat on the flagstone steps. He read consecutive chapters, and there was no skipping around. It seemed to me that we were often there when so-and-so begat so-and-so, who begat ...the lengthy genealogies. We started to giggle especially when he came to funny sounding names especially what we heard as 'Pegleg,' my nickname. He would then intone a prayer that sounded the same, finishing, "Give us rest, we pray thee, in sleep and fit us for what thou hast for us on the morrow."

Aunt Edith spent a lot of time weeding her vast vegetable garden. I didn't mind joining her. It was there that I learned to love the feel of dirt and the satisfaction of seeing a clean row of tomato plants or beans. I can still spend many hours weeding in anticipation of that satisfaction. I painted the shutters on the house probably twice over the years. I guess Aunt Edith thought that I did a good enough job because she had me continue painting furniture and floors.

There was one July I will never forget. The sky looked very strange late one afternoon as though there was a crazy storm headed our way. I was standing in the kitchen doorway when I saw a

dark cone shaped pillar in the sky. My first and last experience with a tornado passed us by, but hit the Naylor Farm just next to us. Mrs. Naylor was in the milk house. She lifted her head in reaction to the sudden intense noise, just as the roof lifted and she found herself looking up into the sky. Those stone walls had held firm and she was not hurt.

Sometime later we were out in the front yard after supper when a small plane flew overhead. There were flames shooting out of the wing. Then as though we were watching a movie, we saw the pilot jump, his parachute exploded above him and he landed in the pasture across the road directly in front of our house. The plane crashed in Mr. Naylor's corn field. The village came out to see the wreckage and to tear off pieces of the yellow canvas. The pilot hurt his knees but said that that was the first time he had agreed to wear a chute.

The third incident that same month was a fire. It was Saturday night and Mr. and Mrs. Love were heating bath water in a huge tub under the staircase. They lived only one mile away from Cherry Lane Farm, across from the Buggy Wheel. The six children were finished and already upstairs in bed when the stairway caught fire. Mr. Love was only able to save one son as access to the upstairs was completely cut off. Uncle Robert and Aunt Edith took in Mr. and Mrs. Love and their boy and settled them in the little cottage at the end of our farm house. I still cry when I think of this tragedy and that I didn't know how to express to the family the sadness I felt at the loss of five children in the course of a few minutes.

In 1947 when I entered 10th grade we moved to the farm so that mother could be with and eventually care for Aunt Edith and Uncle Robert full time. I spent every summer of my life on the farm except 1936 when we went to up-state NY to my grandmother's house and two summers during college when I had a job in Lake George NY. When we went overseas to Tunisia in 1961 we packed and loaded our trailer with our luggage under those maple trees. The next year my aunt and uncle died and the farm was sold.

Today when we drive through Wycombe and turn down Park Avenue to Cherry Lane Farm, my heart longs to be able to walk up that lane and walk across the flagstone porch through the screen door to the flagstone kitchen where so many of my childhood memories took place. And hug Aunt Edith, and laugh as she shakes her shoulders because she doesn't like it when I touch those little curls on the back of her neck and sit on Uncle Robert's knee while he sings "The Bear Went Over the Mountain" dropping us through his knees.

But the cherry trees have been cut down; the creek pasture is almost a forest. The bull pen is gone as is the milk house and the sheds and the corn crib. The cow stanchions have been removed and the haymow where we stole the squabs and where we climbed the ladder and jumped into the hay yelling, "I am the queen of the world!" as we hurtled through space to the bed of hay below is now a fancy apartment. Some of the original 80 acres have been sold and newer looking houses have been built in at least one of the pastures and in the field behind the orchard.

The house now has red shutters and the maple trees are gone. But the view from the road to the house is still about the same. The lawns are manicured and the flowers are beautiful. The present owners don't rely on calves to mow their lawn. They have opened the fire places and placed antiques everywhere. They and their two sons love it as much as we did.

Change has come, landmarks are missing, but memories refuse to fade.

Homer Bullock and Mary Florence Rector



Homer Bullock was born in Crosby, Town of Barrington, Yates County, NY in 1888 the youngest son of Herman Bullock and Drusilla Asenith Finton. Herman Bullock operated a sawmill and grape basket factory at his home in Crosby along the lake. Drusilla's brother, George Washington Finton also owned and operated a basket factory less than a mile north of Herman's factory. *The photo of Homer to the left was taken circa 1911*.

Mary Florence Rector was born in Second Milo, Yates County, NY in 1889 the daughter of Stephen Milton Rector and Minnie Nichols. She graduated from Penn Yan Academy in

1908 and, after being trained at Keuka Normal School, taught in one room schools in Jerusalem and Milo for a year each. *The photo of Mary to*

the right was taken circa 1908.

Homer told many stories about the lake including Glenn Curtiss' practice airplane flights off the lake; how the lake steamers would stop at many points around the lake to pick up passengers and the grape harvest; and how he would swim across the lake. Homer grew up helping his father in the basket factory and saw mill. This is where he learned the love of shaping and treating wood and wood products that stayed with him all his life.

While his three older brothers went to college and one to graduate school, Homer never finished high school. The oldest son, Joseph Finton Bullock went to Colgate University and became a District

Superintendent of Schools in Yates County from 1912 to 1948. William Wallace Bullock also graduated from Colgate and went on to graduate school at Columbia University; he was a school



teacher and principal of several schools in New York State. Edgar Bullock went to West Virginia University and graduated as a mechanical engineer. Homer did not graduate from high school; he did attend in North Cohocton and Cuba, NY where his older brother, William, was the principal.

In 1908, Herman and Drusilla bought land and moved to the Isle of

Pines, Cuba. Homer made at least two trip to Santa Fe, Isle of Pines to stay with his parents, but for the most part stayed in the States. *The photo to the left above shows Homer helping his parents prepare for planting on the Isle of Pines*. He did operate the saw mill during the years

between 1905 and 1910 and on one of his jobs he met his future wife, Mary Florence Rector. It seems that while doing some mill work with his portable steam saw mill for S. M. Rector in Second Milo; while on the job he met S. M.'s daughter Mary for the first time.

Homer and Mary were married on 6 September 1911 at the home of her parents. As recorded by the Penn Yan paper "the Rev. Dr. Bethel, pastor of the Second Milo Baptist Church officiated the house was decorated with goldenrod and ferns her sister, Miss Helen Rector was honor maid and Joseph Crosby was groomsman later Mr. Bullock left with his bride for Crosby, where they will reside." Their first child, Herman Stephen, was born in 1913 but died of complications from convulsions at the age four and a half. Philip Gerald was born in 1916 in Penn Yan while his parents were living at the Lown place in Second Milo. Later, while Homer worked for a brief period as a conductor on the trolley between Seneca Falls and Geneva, the family lived in Waterloo, Seneca County.

Homer's brother Edgar had respiratory problems so he went to live with Herman and Drusilla in Cuba sometime after 1910. There he met some Cuban businessmen who wanted a source for crates to package fruits for the West Indies Fruit Importing Company. Edgar was

hired and set out to build and run the Pine-Box Lumber Company at Abra Grande. To help with the factory, Edgar asked Homer to come to the Isle of Pines. So in 1919 Homer, Mary and young Philip Gerald went to live in the tropics. While they were there Ruth Hope Bullock was born in 1920. The photo to the right of Homer, Mary, Phil, and Ruth was taken on the Isle of Pines



in 1920. Mary Florence Rector Bullock would later tell Isle of Pines stories about sweeping large spiders out of their house and the awful tropical heat and humidity. While in Cuba, Homer taught himself to play the saxophone; a talent that helped him later when in East Bloomfield he formed a little musical group to play at banquets and meetings. The family left the Isle of Pines in 1924 to go back to the states so the children, Philip and Ruth, could attend school.

While Homer was in Abra Grande, he became interested in tropical woods, made a study of the different kinds, and found out where they were located on the Isle of Pines. When he returned to Yates County, he teamed up with Howard Swarthout to set up the Woodcraft Products Corporation to make various novelties from tropical woods imported from the Isle of Pines. Howard was the husband of Mary's sister, Helen Egeria Rector. Homer went straight back to Cuba and spent six months collecting the wood. A building was built in Second Milo and turning lathes were assembled but the business never got off the ground. Robert Homer and Calvin Fenton were born to Homer and Mary in 1926 and 1928 respectively. They lived in Penn Yan, Crosby, and Second Milo during this period.

Homer became the manager of the Singer Sewing Machine store in Geneva the summer of 1928, so the family moved to the Herman Brehm house in Waterloo. Paul David was born in that house in 1929, delivered by Dr. Holmes. When the great depression of 1929 hit, Homer lost

his job with Singer. He spent the next few years, when he could get the work, delivering coal. While in Waterloo, Philip graduated from high school.

In 1934 Clarence Wemett from Hemlock, NY hired Homer to do wood turning at the Roadside Craftsman in East Bloomfield. The family moved first to the Cook house next to the



Holloway House and across the street from the Congregational Church; then to the Condon house next to the Roadside Craftsman; and then to the Parmalee house which was next to the Page house. The photo to the left shows the Roadside Craftsmen building; Ruth is standing on the right.

During this period Philip worked at the Roadside Craftsman; for Lear Radio in New York City; and for Rittenhouse in Honeoye Falls. He was drafted into the U. S. Army in 1941 and served as a Radio Operator in an Anti-Aircraft Battalion in Australia and New Guinea. Ruth Hope graduated from high school in 1938, earned an R. N. at Genesee Hospital, and married Peter James Vandenbergh Jr. in 1943. Peter served in the U. S. Navy on board ship in the Pacific.

Homer had a variety of interests including raising rare breeds of pigeons, keeping honeybees, making violins, playing saxophone in his orchestra, and studying the Bible. When work became slow at the Roadside Craftsman, Homer worked at a furniture factory in Rochester and during the war worked at a defense plant in Rochester. Because of the economic situation Mary had to work doing housework, picking cherries, sorting peaches and eggs, and baby sitting.



Homer, Mary, and family were members of the First
Methodist Church in East Bloomfield where both taught
Sunday school classes from time to time. *The church is shown in the photo to the right above.*Robert Homer and his family are, at the time of this writing, still members of this church.



In 1944, the Rubinstein house in Holcomb was purchased by Homer and Mary. This home, the first owned by them, was a large home on East Main Street and is presently owned by Richard R. Rayburn. *The Holcomb home is pictured on the left*. The large barn behind the house was remodeled into a wood shop and when Philip was

discharged from the Army in 1945, Homer established his own business which survived for several years. At one time, he had as many as four employees to assist in the fabrication of

wooden items such as professional view camera parts, display cases, novelty boxes, and broom heads. Philip worked with him for a few years as did his son-in-law Peter Vandenbergh Jr. Ruth Hope Bullock Vandenbergh and her son David Peter Vandenbergh lived with Homer and Mary while her husband served in the Navy.

During these years, Robert Homer graduated from high school, served in the U. S. Navy, married Gwendolyn June Morrow, and attended Syracuse University. Calvin Fenton graduated from high school, served in the U. S. Army, married Catherine Helen Jean Spy, graduated from the State University of New York at Oswego, and graduated from Dallas Theological Seminary. Paul David graduated from high school, graduated from State University of New York at Albany, served in the U. S. Army, received a graduate degree from the University of Michigan, and married Anne Barclay Ashman. Mary worked in the wood shop with Homer and later was employed in the Bloomfield Central School cafeteria for several years. *The photo to the right shows Homer and Mary working in the shop.*




During this time, to be close to family, Homer's brother William Wallace and his wife, Harriett, moved to Holcomb across the street from Homer in the Barden house. William Wallace



also moved a small building containing his wood shop from Manchester, NY to an area next to Homer's wood shop; William was an amateur woodworker. The photo to the left shows Mary and Homer at Paul and Anne's wedding in June 1957. Homer died a month later.

This story ends with Homer's death in Holcomb in 1957 at the age of 69. Mary survived him by almost 16 years. Both Homer and Mary are buried in the East Bloomfield Cemetery near the Methodist Church.




